Nirjala Ekadasi - A Fasting Holy Day

Nirjala Ekadasi is a Hindu Holy Day falling on the 11th Lunar Day of the waxing fortnight of the Hindu month of Jyestha (June 17th, 2024). This

Ekadasi derives its name from the waterless fast observed on this day. It is considered to be the most austere and the most sacred of all 24 Ekadashis in the year. Food and water must not be touched during the fasting hours. However, those who cannot observe Nirjala Ekadasi can take milk and fruit. Grains are strictly prohibited, along with meat, fish and eggs. The fast must start at Sunrise. The fast must be broken the next day between 5:56am and 10:36am.

The Story of Nirjala Ekadasi

Once Bhimasena, the younger brother of Maharaja Yudhishthira, asked the great sage Srila Vyasadeva, the grandfather of the Pandavas, if it is possible to return to the spiritual

world without having observed all the rules and regulations of the Ekadasi fasts.

Bhimasena then spoke as follows,



"Oh greatly intelligent and learned grandfather, my brother Yudhishthira, my dear mother Kunti, and my beloved wife Draupadi, as well as Arjuna, Nakula and Sahadeva, fast completely on each Ekadasi and strictly follow all the rules, guidelines and regulative injunctions of that

sacred day. Being very religious, they always tell me that I should also fast on that day.

"But, Oh learned grandfather, I tell

them that I cannot live without eating, because as the son of Vasudeva (the digestive air), hunger is unbearable to me."

"I can give widely in charity and worship Lord Keshava properly with all manner of wonderful upacharas (items), but I cannot be asked to fast on Ekadasi."

"Please tell me how I can obtain the same merits or results with-

out fasting."

SVANA YATRA PATHING CEREMONY OF LORD JAGANATHA, SUBHADDA AND RALADEVA

Lord Balarama, Lady Subhadra, and Lord Jagannath

Snana Yatra—Lord Jagannath's Birthday!

A special bath of Jagannath takes place on the Purnima of Jyestha month (Devasnan Purnima) to commemorate the appearance day of Lord Jagannath. According to Skanda Purana, when Raja Indradyumna installed the wooden Deities, he arranged this bathing ceremony. This day is considered to be the birthday of Lord Jagannath. Held on the full-moon day of the month of Jyestha, this festival is also simultaneously held in Puri, attracts thousands of visitors and pilgrims from all over the country.

'Niladri Mohadaya', a religious text written in Orissan (Oriya) records the rituals of the festival. Sriharsa in his 'naisadhiya Charita' (XV.89) also refers to this festival of Purusottama. This bathing ceremony has a specialty. As this festival does not find mention in the early religious texts, it is believed to be a tribal ceremony. Lord Jagannath in His early form was being worshipped as Nilamadhava by a Savara chief called Viswabasu. The story is nicely told in the drama Jagannath Priyan natakam. Till now it is the Daitas and Savars (tribals) who have the exclusive right to conduct the festival. The tribals called Saoras (of southern Orissa) still perform a rite to bath their Deities ceremonially on the last day of the month of Jyestha. For this, they collect water from remote Jungles where it remains untouched, even by the shadow of the animals. over the country.

Who Is Srimati Tulasi Devi? mentioned ways lives eternally in the Vaikuntha world?



If someone sows a Tulasi plant somewhere, certainly he becomes devoted to Lord Krishna. And when the Tulasi leaves are offered in devotion at the lotus feet of Krishna, there is the full development of love of Godhead.

Srimati Tulasi devi is one of the most exalted devotees of Sri Krishna, All scriptures stress on the importance of getting the mercy of Tulasi devi if one has to make progress in devotion.

In the Skanda Purana, it is said: 'Tulasi is auspicious in all respects. Simply by seeing, touching, remembering, praying to, bowing before, hearing about or sowing this tree, there is always auspiciousness. Anyone who comes in touch with the Tulasi tree in the above-

Above this material world is the eternal spiritual world comprising millions of Vaikuntha planets. The topmost planet in Vaikuntha is Goloka, presided over by Sri Krishna in His original form. Here resides Vrinda devi, an intimate associate of and an expansion of Srimati Radharani. Her partial expansion is Tulasi devi in the Vaikuntha planets, and all Tulasi plants are considered non-different from her.

Another name for the fire of digestion is Vrika. It is this powerful fire that resided in Bhima's stomach.

Only when I eat to my full satisfaction does the fire in my stomach become satisfied. Oh great sage, I might possibly be able to fast only once, so I beg that you tell me of an Ekadasi that is worthy of my fasting and that includes all other Ekadashis.

At the beginning, I shall faithfully observe that fast and hopefully still become eligible for liberation's release."

Srila Vyasadeva replied, "Oh King, you have heard from me about the various kinds of occupational duties, such as elaborate Vedic ceremonies and pujas."

"In the Kali-yuga, however, no one will be able to observe all these occupational & functional duties properly."

"I shall therefore tell you how, at practically no expense, one can endure some small austerity and achieve the greatest benefit and resultant happiness."

"The essence of what is written in the Vedic literatures known as the Puranas is that one should not eat on either the dark or light fortnight Ekadashis."

Observing Ekadasi strictly is a great aid in that process, and here Shrila Vyasadeva is simply stressing to Bhima the importance of the Ekadasi vratam.

"One who fasts on Ekadashi is saved from going to the hellish planets."

Hearing Srila Vyasadeva's words, the son of Vayu, Bhimasena, the strongest of all warriors, became frightened and began to shake like a leaf on a banyan tree in a strong wind.

The frightened Bhimasena then said, "Oh Grandfather, what should I do? I am completely unable and ill equipped to fast twice in a month throughout the year! Please tell me of the one fasting day that will bestow the greatest benefit upon me!"

Vyasadeva replied, "Without drinking even water, you should fast on the Ekadasi that occurs during the light fortnight of the month of Jyeshtha (May -June) when the sun travels in the sign of Taurus (Vrishabh) and Gemini (Mithun)."

"According to learned personalities, on this day one may bathe and perform Acamana for pratiprokshana purification."

"One must certainly not eat anything, for if he does so, he breaks his fast. This rigid fast is in effect from sunrise on the Ekadasi day to sunrise on the Dwadashi day. If a person endeavors to observe this great fast very strictly, he easily achieves the result of observing all twenty-four other Ekadasi fasts throughout the entire year."

"Oh Bhimasena, one who can fast on this special Ekadasi in this manner reaps the benefit of having fasted on every Ekadasi during the year. There is no doubt of this, nor should there be."

Then He told me that, "One who fasts on this Ekadasi, without taking even drinking water or eating, becomes free of all sinful reactions, and that one who observes the difficult nirjala fast on Jyeshthashukla Ekadasi truly reaps the benefit of all other Ekadasi fasts."

"Oh Bhimasena, in the Kali-yuga, the age of quarrel and hypocrisy, when all the principles of the Vedas will have been destroyed or greatly minimized, and when there will be no proper charity or observance of the ancient Vedic principles and ceremonies, how will there be any means of purifying the self?"

"But there is the opportunity to fast on Ekadasi and become free of all one's past sins."
